**Gerald Frug** is the Louis D. Brandeis Professor of Law at Harvard Law School. Educated at the University of California at Berkeley and Harvard Law School, he worked as a Special Assistant to the Chairman of the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, in Washington, D.C., and as Health Services Administrator of the City of New York before he began teaching in 1974 at the University of Pennsylvania Law School. He joined the Harvard faculty in 1981. He has published dozens of articles on the topic of local government law and is the author, among other works, of a casebook on *Local Government Law* (4<sup>th</sup> edition 2006, with David Barron and Richard T. Ford), *Dispelling the Myth of Home Rule* (2004, with David Barron and Rick Su), and *City Making: Building Communities without Building Walls* (Princeton University Press 1999).
