Moshe Semyonov is the Bernard and Audre Rapoport Chair Professor of the Sociology of Labor at Tel Aviv University, where he teaches in the Department of Sociology and the Department of Labor Studies. He is also the Director of the University Institute for Diplomacy and Regional Cooperation at Tel Aviv University. Moshe Semyonov's research interests lie in the areas of comparative social stratification and mobility focusing on structural sources of social and economic inequalities, global labor migration and status of immigrants in host societies. His current research projects deal with the dynamics of ethnic, gender and socioeconomic inequality (mostly in the labor market), sources of wealth inequality and causes and consequences of global labor migration. He has published nearly 80 refereed articles in top sociology and social science journals.
