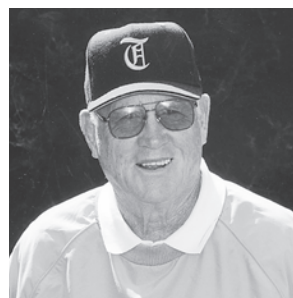


Golf at Trinity

The Trinity College golf squad, under the direction of 2006 and 2007 NESCAC Coach of the Year Bill Detrick, is eager to begin the 2008-09 season after enjoying the best campaign in the program's history a year ago. The 2007-08 Bantams won the first NESCAC Fall Championship Qualifying Tournament, earning them the right to host the Spring Championship, and followed that with their first ECAC Championship title. Trinity closed 2007 with a sixth-place finish among all Division III colleges in the New England Championship Tournament on Cape Cod, and claimed fourth place in the NESCAC Spring Championship to round out the spring slate.



Sophomore Josh Grossman shot a two-round score of 146 to earn NESCAC golf medalist honors and give the Bantams the last three individual champions in the league. Grossman was named as the NESCAC Player of the Year and to the all-league first team, joining 2007 NESCAC Gold Medalist and 2008 Bantam senior co-captain Reid Longley on that team. The pair join fellow senior co-captain Josh Biren, senior Alec MacColl, 2006 All-NESCAC junior David Anderson, and sophomore Jay Driscoll in their quest for a NESCAC crown in both seasons and a bid to the NCAA Tourney in 2009.



Entering his 18th season at Trinity, **Bill Detrick** has fielded a squad capable of finishing among the top teams in New England each year. The Bantams tied for first place in the NESCAC and won the Division III title (6th among all divisions) at the New England Championships in 2006-07.

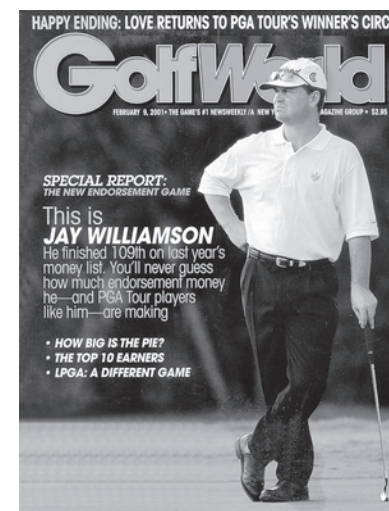
Last season, Trinity topped that by winning the first annual NESCAC Fall Championship Qualifier and the ECAC title. All four of these accomplishments were the best finishes in the history of the Trinity golf program. The 2001, 2006, and 2007 NESCAC Coach of the Year, Detrick has coached no less than the last three NESCAC Individual Medalists. He is assisted by former Bantam captain **Jay Pulaski**.

Detrick came to Trinity in 1990 after a legendary tenure as head men's basketball coach at Central Connecticut State University, where the gymnasium bears his name. A 1950 graduate of Central Connecticut, where he earned a bachelor's degree in business education, Detrick also has a master's degree in guidance from New York University.

Shuttle Meadow Country Club, Trinity's practice course, is among the most beautiful golf courses in Connecticut. The Bantams play at some of the top courses in the region each week in both the fall and spring, and will host tournaments this fall at four of Connecticut's top venues including the TPC River Highlands.

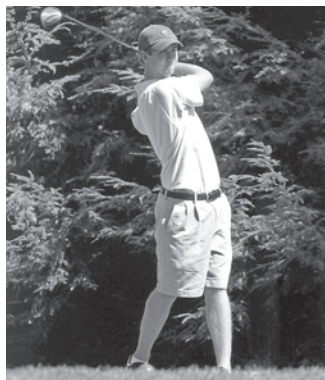
