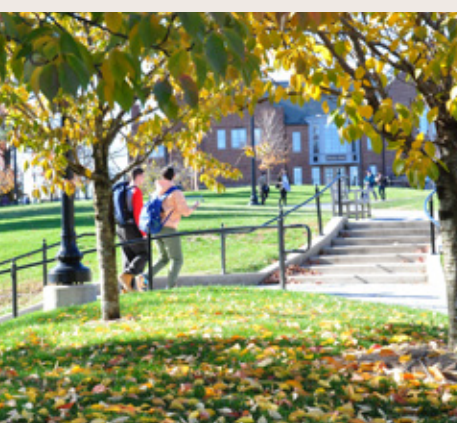

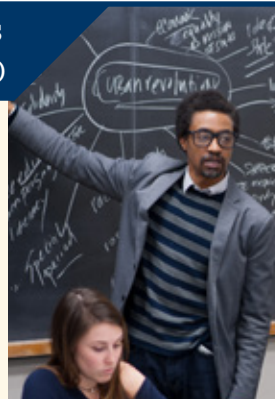

### ENDOWMENT

The market value of Trinity's  
endowment portfolio at June 30,  
2016, equaled **\$532 million**,  
or **\$235,000** per student.

### BUDGET

Trinity's 2016 operating budget  
amounted to **\$131 million** with  
the following revenue composition:  
**72%** tuition, fee, room, and board  
charges; **14%** endowment income;  
**7%** annual fund; and **7%** grants  
and ancillary activities.
