Dr. Condoleezza Rice is a political scientist and diplomat. Born in Birmingham, Alabama, she grew up in the racialized South, yet successfully completed high school by the age of fifteen, and later earned degrees at the Universities of Denver and Notre Dame. She served as the 66th United States Secretary of State during the George W. Bush administration, and as National Security Adviser during his first term, making her the first woman to serve in that position. In 1977 Dr. Rice worked for the Carter administration in the State Department. Now on the faculty at Stanford University, she teaches political science and is affiliated with the Graduate School of Business.
