Federal and State Aid: Only a FAFSA is required to apply for federal and state financial aid. You may ignore the steps below. If your FAFSA is selected for verification, we will request additional documentation to complete the verification process. Documentation may include such items as tax returns, W-2 statements and a verification worksheet.

Trinity Institutional Aid: The Trinity College IDP Institutional Aid Application is required to apply for Trinity Institutional aid assistance. Please follow all of the steps listed below.
