

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Many years ago, our music director, Lisa Williamson, and I worked together on Massenet's opera *Cendrillon*. This opened a deep curiosity for me about the fairy tale *Cinderella*. I have always been drawn to this story in its many forms: *The Turkey Girl* from the Zuni, the Chinese *Tale of Yeh-Shen, The Golden Sandal* from the Middle East, and *Mufaro's Beautiful Daughters* from Zimbabwe, to name a few. As a theater artist, I am excited about pieces in which I can see myself in all the characters. Fairy tales have a way of becoming a mirror for us, and how they are staged can be a barometer for what our society is reflecting on and moving toward.

Our production uses the book by Douglas Carter Beane, and because of this, we are introduced to some new characters and their new concerns. Our landscape is one of unrest, with tensions between the monarchy and the village. We have political activists, royal figures desperate to cling to the status quo and squash change, and compassionate moments between the stepfamily and Cinderella. These important complications allow us (artists and audience) to enter the timelessness of Cinderella with our current questions and wonderings.

Cinderella is able, with the help of a wise Godmother and some magic, to see beyond initial appearances. Rags are made into riches, everyday objects-worn and broken- hold a mystery, magic, power, and beauty far beyond superficial wealth. The one covered in ashes and dust is the most brilliant jewel of all. That is a joyful proposition.

Thank you for being here and accompanying us as we journey through this enchanted tale!
