#### Doctor of Humane Letters

You could be forced to leave your home. You could be forced to become a refugee. You could lose any material possession that you have, but the one thing that cannot be taken away from you is your education."

You recalled these inspiring words of your parents during a recent 60 Minutes interview about the important work done at the School of Leadership Afghanistan, or SOLA, which you co-founded and for which you serve as president. SOLA is the first and only Afghan-led boarding school for Afghan girls in the world.

Your deep ties to education began in 1996, when you were only 6 years old, growing up in Kabul. The Taliban had seized power and forbade girls from attending school. Your parents, wisely valuing education for all, dressed you as a boy so you could accompany your older sister—who could not be in public without a male chaperone—to school. After the regime fell in 2001, you were selected to attend a year of high school in the United States through a highly competitive program funded by the U.S. State Department. You blossomed in Wisconsin and went on to Middlebury College, graduating magna cum laude and earning a B.A. in international studies and women and gender studies. While at Middlebury, your honors included being awarded a Davis Projects for Peace grant to build wells in your home country, being named one of the Top Ten College Women of the Year by *Glamour* magazine in 2010, and winning the Madeleine M. Kunin Public Service Award in 2011.

Importantly, your college years also were spent planting the seeds for SOLA, with the mission of providing access to quality education for girls across your homeland. Since its earliest beginnings, SOLA thrived, growing its enrollment from year to year. In 2021, however, the Taliban's return to rule forced a massive change—a move from Kabul to the nation of Rwanda. You courageously led the evacuation of SOLA's students and staff and reestablished the school on another continent, and SOLA has continued to grow, welcoming new students from the Afghan diaspora each year.

Your achievements with SOLA have not gone unnoticed, as you've received numerous accolades, including winning in 2018 the Malalai Medal, one of Afghanistan's highest national honors, for your work promoting girls' access to education and being named in 2019 to the *Forbes* 30 Under 30 Asia list in social entrepreneurship. You also have received honorary degrees from Roger Williams University, the University of Scranton, Cedar Crest College, and SOAS University of London. Since 2012, you have been a global ambassador for Girl Rising, a nonprofit with the stated mission of using the power of storytelling to change the way the world values girls and their education. In 2023, the National Geographic Society named you the Rolex National Geographic Explorer of the Year.

And to this day, you and the girls of SOLA have never stopped exploring, never stopped seeking out new pathways of opportunity. In the spring of 2024, you launched SOLAx, a WhatsApp-based online academy that brings education into the palm of a student's hand. You enrolled more than 18,000 students in SOLAx in just its first year of operation, and your admissions season for new students to join SOLA's campus in Rwanda is underway as we speak.

The need is real. In Afghanistan today, by Taliban decree, a girl's education ends after sixth grade. No secondary school. No college. No graduation days. With SOLA, you are working to push back the darkness and to bring hope to an entire generation of young women.

In recognition of your extraordinary accomplishments and leadership in your quest to educate and to elevate Afghan girls, I have the honor of presenting you, Shabana Basij-Rasikh, for the degree of Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*.

#### JOSEPH M. CONNORS

## Trinity College Class of 1969

Doctor of Science

Healing. That's the one simple word you used 50 years ago on a Trinity College alumni survey to describe the nature of your work. Five decades later, it is clear that you have dedicated your professional life to healing, focusing your clinical and research efforts in the area of lymphoid cancers and on the application of genomic analysis to understanding and optimizing treatment for these diseases.

Now clinical professor emeritus in the Department of Medicine, Division of Medical Oncology, at the University of British Columbia and past clinical director of the BC Cancer Centre for Lymphoid Cancer, you are best known for your clinical investigations into the biology and treatment of Hodgkin lymphoma, non-Hodgkin lymphoma, chronic lymphocytic leukemias, and myeloma. Your vast expertise is evident in the more than 500 peer-reviewed scientific articles and dozens of book chapters you have published, all addressing various aspects of research into lymphoid cancers. You also have lectured around the world, sharing your knowledge with others.

Your tremendous work has been met with a plethora of accolades. They include being named, in 2020, as a member of the Order of Canada—considered the cornerstone of the Canadian Honours System—which recognizes outstanding achievement, dedication to the community, and service to the nation. You have been named as a Clarivate Web of Science Highly Cited Researcher—a recognition given to the top 0.1 percent of researchers worldwide—every year since the list began in 2014. In 2015, you received the MD Anderson Cancer Center Charles A. Koller, M.D., Lectureship Award, and in 2013, you received a Canadian Medical Association Lifetime Achievement Award and the Dr. Don Rix Award for Lifetime Achievement from Life Sciences BC. You also have twice been the recipient of the Terry Fox Cancer Research Award by the British Columbia Medical Association, in 2018 and in 1983.

Your leadership in the field has included membership in numerous professional organizations, including the American Society of Hematology, the Canadian Medical Association, and the American Society of Clinical Oncology. You've also served on myriad scientific committees and advisory boards, as well as on several editorial boards and as an editorial consultant to a host of well-respected publications including *The New England Journal of Medicine*, the Journal of the National Cancer Institute, Blood, and Annals of Oncology.

At Trinity, you graduated Phi Beta Kappa with honors with a B.S. in biology. During your time 'neath the elms, in addition to being a member of Theta Xi, you took part in the 1968 two-day sit-in near the President's Office, where approximately 160 students demanded that the trustees consider a recent Senate proposal concerning scholarships for Black students. Your participation served as evidence of your uncompromising personal ethics and unyielding dedication to social justice.

You went on to earn an M.D., cum laude, from Yale University in 1973 and completed your internship and residency in internal medicine at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. In 1979, you headed to the West Coast and Stanford University for your clinical fellowship in medical oncology. Two years later, you moved north to British Columbia, Canada, where you embarked on a 38-year career targeted at treating and curing cancer.

In recognition of your groundbreaking research, your unfailing determination to triumph over cancer, and your lifelong dedication to healing, I have the honor of presenting you, Joseph M. Connors, for the degree of Doctor of Science, *honoris causa*.

#### EDWARD MINER LAMONT JR.

#### Doctor of Laws

Your devotion to public service, you have said, comes from a deep belief in making a positive difference in people's lives. Elected as the 89th governor of the State of Connecticut in 2018, you use the tools garnered from your background in business and technology to aid in your efforts to improve the state's economy, to address income inequality, and to improve infrastructure and education systems. You also ably led Connecticut through the COVID-19 pandemic, an accomplishment that helped propel you to victory when you ran for reelection in 2022.

Your path to the Governor's Office began with your education at some of the nation's top schools. After graduating from Phillips Exeter Academy, where you served as president of the student newspaper, *The Exonian*, you earned a B.A. in sociology from Harvard College in 1976. You went on to earn an M.B.A. from the Yale School of Management in 1980.

Your first position out of school was as editor of the *Black River Tribune*, a small, weekly newspaper in Ludlow, Vermont. Through your responsibilities of covering town meetings and the Board of Selectmen, you gained firsthand knowledge about how government entities run.

In 1984, you founded Campus Televideo, a company that provides cable and satellite services to college campuses nationwide. You later chaired Lamont Digital Systems, a telecommunications firm that invests in new media start-ups. For four years, you shared your business acumen with the State Department of Treasury as chairman of the Investment Advisory Council, which was created by the Connecticut General Assembly to assist the state treasurer on investment policies; in this role, among other duties, you oversaw a multibillion-dollar state pension fund. Your vast experience also includes serving as a member of the Greenwich Board of Selectmen and of the Board of Estimate and Taxation, where you collaborated in a bipartisan effort to safeguard a multimillion-dollar budget.

You also have devoted your time as an educator. You have served as an adjunct professor of political science and philosophy at Central Connecticut State University, where you helped to found a popular business start-up competition. You have volunteered to teach at Harding High School in Bridgeport, where, in an effort to spark entrepreneurship, you shared your enormous expertise about the inner workings of small businesses, bringing in local businesspeople to share their experiences and wisdom and helping to place students in internships.

As a key partner in Trinity's successes, you have long felt that you have a strong connection with the College. You have noted that you view the relationship between Trinity and the state as being a vital one, particularly with the College's location in the heart of the capital city. Through your extensive knowledge in the fields of government and education, you recognize the essential role that Trinity plays in shaping the workforce and economy of Connecticut, today and in the future.

In recognition of your lifelong devotion to public service and your unfaltering commitment to education, as well as your leadership of our great State of Connecticut, I have the honor of presenting you, Edward Miner Lamont Jr., for the degree of Doctor of Laws, *honoris causa*.
