“Her dedication and lasting contributions have made both Trinity and the broader community a better place.”

These words about you by Trinity alumna Francesca Borges Gordon '82, published in a 2025 *Trinity Reporter* alumni magazine tribute, offer a clear and succinct perspective of your time as the 22nd president of Trinity College.

Leading the institution from 2014 to 2025 as the first African American and first woman to serve as president, you were committed to the oversight of transformational changes in curriculum, enrollment, financial aid, student retention and outcomes, operational excellence, and fundraising, including seeing through to completion the historic All In campaign.

Among your many accomplishments, you served as the driving force behind multiple student-centered initiatives, including the Bantam Network mentoring program for first-year students. You prioritized Trinity's relationship with its home city as you worked tirelessly to strengthen the College's relationship with Hartford, including by expanding the campus footprint into downtown with the establishment of an innovation hub and the Liberal Arts Action Lab, part of the thriving Center for Hartford Engagement and Research.

As the product—and champion—of a liberal arts education, you have a distinguished background in neuroscience. You earned a B.A. in psychobiology from Wellesley College, an M.P.H. in environmental health sciences from the University of California, Berkeley, and a Ph.D. in neurotoxicology from the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, where you did the proof of concept work on Razadyne, one of the world's most widely used Alzheimer's drugs. You completed postdoctoral training at the National Institute of Health (INSERM) in Paris, France. You have authored more than 60 scientific publications and have held grants from the National Institutes of Health, the National Science Foundation, and numerous private foundations, and you hold two drug patents.

You came to Trinity from Tufts University, where you served as dean of the School of Arts and Sciences. You began your academic career at your undergraduate alma mater, Wellesley, as an assistant professor of biology, later becoming the Allene Lummis Russell (Endowed) Professor of Neuroscience, director of the Neuroscience Program, and an associate dean. Your research focused on mouse models of neurological disorders, including Alzheimer's disease, schizophrenia, and Rett syndrome, and how to cure them through pharmaceutical interventions.

Your numerous accolades include winning the National Science Foundation Young Investigator Award and the Society for Neuroscience Lifetime Mentoring Award and being named a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and the International Behavioral Neuroscience Society.

Your tremendous leadership experience includes serving on the boards of the Henry Luce Foundation, the Institute of International Education, the Allen Institute, the Dana Foundation, and the Hartford Symphony Orchestra; you also recently served as chair of the board of Hartford HealthCare.

A lifelong educator, you continue to share your expertise through Health and Science Solutions Inc., your recently founded firm that partners with academic and health leaders and boards to create sustainable solutions to leadership challenges. Next you will take your experience to Harvard Graduate School of Education as you embark on a one-year term as its president-in-residence.

In recognition of your achievements as a world-renowned neuroscientist, your unflinching belief in the power of a liberal arts education, and your enduring legacy as Trinity College's 22nd president, I have the honor of presenting you, Joanne Berger-Sweeney, for the degree of Doctor of Science, *honoris causa*.

You were a member of the second class of women at Trinity, a trailblazer who thrived. You majored in both French and religion, served as a teaching assistant in the French Department, sang in the Concert Choir, and participated as an early member of the varsity women’s squash team. You have said that your “undergraduate experience was truly transformative, leaving you with an enduring passion for education and the desire to make similar experiences possible for all students.”

That passion and desire have guided your career in advancement and higher education, most recently when you returned to the College in 2023 to shepherd the All In campaign after then-Vice President for Advancement Michael Casey tragically passed away. You first stepped into the role of executive director of the campaign after serving as a consultant and adviser. Your intimate knowledge of—and round-the-clock commitment to—Trinity’s goals and strategic objectives helped you guide the historic effort to success. The College also benefited from your vast experience through your expert leadership of the Advancement Division, from which you retired last year as interim vice president. During your brief tenure, Trinity raised the highest level of annual philanthropic support in its history.

Your professional journey includes 15 years at Dartmouth College, where you served as senior vice president for advancement and led the \$1.3 billion Campaign for the Dartmouth Experience through the Great Recession to its successful December 2009 completion. Before Dartmouth, you spent more than a decade at Harvard University, where you served as associate director of university development and director of external relations. There you helped plan the launch of Harvard’s \$2.3 billion campaign, an effort that was completed successfully in 1999. Prior to Harvard, you served as executive vice president of The Williamson Group, a start-up providing computing systems for nonprofits. You also held leadership roles at the National Association of Independent Schools and at your high school alma mater, Northfield Mount Hermon.

Since retiring from Trinity, you have turned your attention to Women’s Lunch Place (WLP) in Boston, a nonprofit that works with more than 2,300 women a year to eliminate hunger, homelessness, and poverty. A WLP board member, you are supporting the organization as it enters a major strategic planning phase and an expansion of its services and philanthropic capacity.

At Trinity, your unwavering dedication is indisputable. You serve as a member of the Presidential Advisers, a group of alumni distinguished by significant, sustained service to Trinity. You have been a member of the Board of Trustees and the Board of Fellows, as well as a Long Walk Societies volunteer, a class agent, and a member of your Reunion Gift Committee. In 2024, you served as your class’s Reunion Gift Chair and led the Class of 1974 to set a 50th Reunion record for Trinity.

Your valued involvement throughout the years has not gone unnoticed. The College honored you in 1999 with the 175th Anniversary Award, given to those who exemplify the College’s mission and uphold its proud tradition of scholarship, leadership, and innovation, and in 1989 with the Alumni Medal for Excellence, awarded annually to alumni who have made significant contributions to their professions, to their communities, and to Trinity.

In recognition of your enormous contributions in the realm of higher education and advancement and of your unflinching commitment to Trinity College and its future, I have the honor of presenting you, Carolyn A. Pelzel, for the degree of Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*.

You once said that entrepreneurship is about betting on yourself and that success offers not only a financial upside but also a great learning experience. You have spent your professional life betting on yourself, and you have been rewarded with tremendous success.

You have worked in six start-ups, serving as CEO of the last three. You led Black Duck Software’s transformation into a global software security leader and in 2018 sold the company to Synopsys, then the world’s 13th-largest software company. Earlier in your career, you were CEO of Reflectant Software, which was acquired by Citrix Systems, and Turbonomic, which ultimately was acquired by IBM. You joined your first pre-revenue software start-up, digital video editing pioneer Avid Technology, in 1990 and lived in Japan while managing Avid’s Asia-Pacific business.

For the past eight years, you have served on several software company boards—including Wasabi Technologies, Fairmarkit, Leapwork, Sentry1, CustomerGauge, and GTreasury—while continuing to teach full time at Harvard Business School, where you pioneered the entrepreneurial sales curriculum. In doing the latter, you have realized a full-circle moment, as you yourself earned an M.B.A. from Harvard.

Your educational path started just northwest of Hartford, in Simsbury, Connecticut. As a member of Trinity’s Class of 1985, you played ice hockey and studied abroad at the London School of Economics on your way to earning a B.A. with honors in economics.

A devoted Trinity alumnus, you made the founding gift to the Elting Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship in 2023. You have served as the chair of the Trinity College Fund and are a member of the Elms Society. In addition, your name has been inscribed on the Wall of Honor, signifying the transformative impact of your philanthropy on the College. You also have shared your wealth of experience through your valuable service on Trinity’s Board of Trustees since 2018.

Your dedication to the blue and gold doesn’t stop there, as you have made it a point during your career to hire and to mentor other Trinity graduates. You have noted that you see in Trinity students the qualities of successful employees: intellectual curiosity; a broad, diverse education; an understanding of the need for diligence and hard work; and a high emotional IQ. Beyond sharing your wisdom with Bantams, you also recently co-authored your first book, *Unlikely Entrepreneurs: Wins, Losses, and Crucial Advice in Building Great Companies*.

You and your wife—your high-school sweetheart Amanda—are the proud parents of three children and live in Andover, Massachusetts.

In recognition of your exceptional entrepreneurial spirit and success and of your unyielding dedication to your undergraduate alma mater, I have the honor of presenting you, N. Louis “Lou” Shipley, for the degree of Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*.
