□ **Recommendation letter**: Only a college professor who is familiar with your performance in the classroom should complete this letter. If you are eligible, and apply for a scholarship, the letter should also address this issue.

□ Photocopy of the photo page of your passport.

□ Scholarship essay if you are applying for financial aid.

Acceptance letters will be issued within two weeks of the completed application review. Your scholarship application is considered a separate part of your program application materials.
