Dear Students, Faculty, and Staff,

On September 18, Campus Safety received a report that three swastikas were carved into a Jewish student's door in Ogilby Hall. This clear expression of hate is offensive and traumatizing, and places an entire community of people in a very present danger. To be clear, the state of Connecticut has categorized such conduct as a hate crime. History has taught us that tolerating such acts of hate in a community often signal to perpetrators that more extreme acts will be tolerated. We as a community will not tolerate behaviors that are anti-Semitic, hateful, or divisive. We condemn and reject these behaviors because they are fully and completely antithetical to what we value as community.

We are working to identify the person who committed this act, and Campus Safety is actively investigating the matter. Given the nature and severity of the allegations that have emerged, the case has been referred to the Assistant Vice President for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion and Compliance Pamela Whitley, who will commence a comprehensive investigation, in accordance with Trinity's Policy on Nondiscrimination.

Our response as a community must match the gravity of this behavior. Holocaust survivor Eli Wiesel famously said that, "The opposite of hate is not love, it's indifference..." What this anti-Semitic act tells us is that there are members within our community who are capable of reflecting the most troubling and disturbing elements of society: those who dehumanize, traumatize, and violate the emotional well-being of others. We call upon each and every one of us to take some action when we witness such behaviors and to never allow this community to become one of indifference.
